On December 1st, 2017, members of the Uniform Field Operations Patrol Division arrested Jestin Almanzar, age 20, of 1350 15th Street #5N, Fort Lee, New Jersey, charging him with one count of: Forgery, Class B Felony and one count of Identity Fraud, Class A Felony.

On November 30th, 2017, a Mont Vernon, New Hampshire resident noticed suspicious activity on their Verizon Wireless account. Five new lines of service were created and five iPhone X cellular telephones with a value of \$4,999.95 were fraudulently ordered. The Mont Vernon Police Department was notified, identifying the final destination of the fraudulent package as the United Parcel Service, 3 Whipple Street, Nashua, New Hampshire 03060. An investigator from the Mont Vernon Police Department contacted United Parcel Service security members along with the Nashua Police Department, who tracked the package's arrival to the sorting facility.

On December 1st, 2017, a male subject arrived at the United Parcel Service – 3 Whipple Street, taking custody of the fraudulent package while displaying a fraudulent and fictitious United States passport card and fraudulent and fictitious Capital One credit card. This subject was stopped by officers while still in possession of the fraudulent package and fictitious identification cards. As a result of the on-scene investigation this subject was placed under arrest. Members of the Nashua Police Department's Traffic Enforcement Unit were notified and furthered the investigation. As a result of the investigation, the suspect was positively identified as Jestin Almanzar.

Jestin was held on \$7,500.00 cash/surety bail pending his arraignment date of December 4th, 2017 in the Hillsborough County Superior Court-South. The investigation is ongoing, with additional charges possible. A Class A Felony is punishable by up to fifteen years of imprisonment, exclusive of fines. A Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years of imprisonment, exclusive of fines.

The Nashua Police Department urges its' citizens to regularly monitor any rotating financial accounts for fraudulent activity. If such fraudulent activity is discovered, contact the corresponding company and the Nashua Police Department to report the activity as fraudulent. 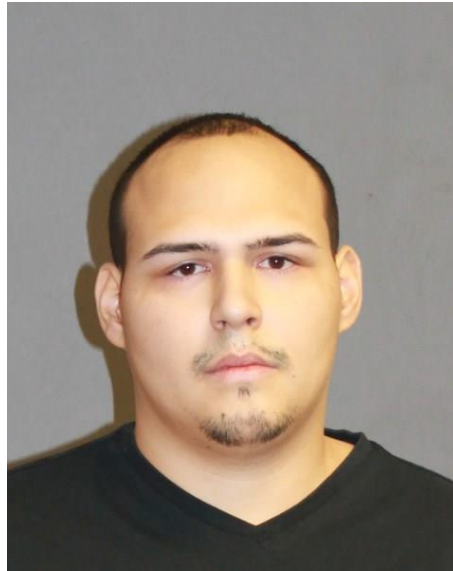
