On June 13, 2018, members of the Nashua Police Department's Narcotics Intelligence Division, Problem Oriented Policing Unit and Traffic Unit conducted another operation as part of the Granite Shield program where two individuals were arrested for drug-related crimes. These individuals were:

Edward Bigelow, Age 40, of 103 Nartoff Road, Hollis, New Hampshire was charged with a one count of Acts Prohibited, Possession of Suboxone, Second Offense, Felony; Habitual Offender, Class B Felony; and Disobeying an Officer, Class A Misdemeanor. He was also arrested on a Capias warrant issued by the Rockingham County Superior Court for failure to appear on the original charge of Possession of Cocaine. He refused bail and will be arraigned on June 14, 2018.

Paul Fidler, Age 53, of 10 Wellington Avenue, Somerville, Massachusetts was charged with one count of Acts Prohibited, Possession of Suboxone, Second Offense, Felony; Acts Prohibited, Possession of Amphetamine/Dextro-amphetamine, Second Offense, Felony; Acts Prohibited, Possession of Gabapentin, Misdemeanor; and Driving after Suspension, Second Offense, Misdemeanor. He was released on \$2,500 Cash or Surety Bail and he will be arraigned on July 5, 2018.

These arrests came at the conclusion of extensive investigations into the distribution of illegal drugs in Nashua and were made possible through funding provided by the Granite Shield program.
