On April 3, 2018 at approximately 7:00 PM, officers from the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau, Patrol Division, arrested James Labombard, age 42, of 32 Paxton Terrace, Nashua, New Hampshire on a warrant for Duty to Report, Class A Felony and another warrant for Criminal Mischief, Class A Misdemeanor.

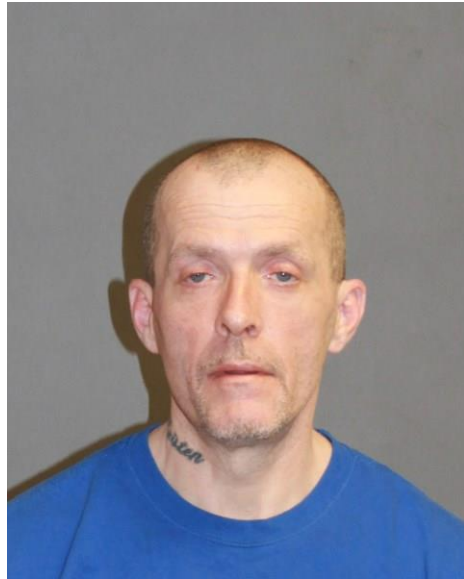
The Nashua Police Department learned that a convicted Sex Offender had returned to an address in Nashua without properly updating his Sex Offender Registration information. An investigation was initiated by the Special Investigations Division. Following the Detective's investigation, it was determined that Labombard failed to report changes to his information as he returned to the City of Nashua and a warrant was obtained for his arrest. Labombard was also charged with Criminal Mischief from a previous incident that occurred in Nashua with a female known to him. As a result of both investigations, he was charged with Duty to Report, Class A Felony and Criminal Mischief, Class A Misdemeanor. James Labombard also missed a court date at Salem District Court and an Electronic Bench Warrant was issued for his arrest.

Labombard was convicted of Felonious Sexual Assault from Hillsborough County Superior Court South in Nashua, New Hampshire on March 20, 1998. Based on that conviction, Labombard is required to register semi-annually as a Tier II Sex Offender for the remainder of his life. Labombard has also been convicted of Duty to Report on July 28, 2005 from Hillsborough County Superior Court South in Nashua, New Hampshire. Thus any subsequent offense of Duty to Report or Duty to Inform is a Class A Felony.

A Class A Felony is punishable by up to fifteen years imprisonment, exclusive of fines. A Class A Misdemeanor is punishable up to one year in the County House of Corrections, exclusive of fines. James Labombard received two bails due to the misdemeanor charge being heard in District Court and the felony charge being heard in Superior Court. Labombard is being held on \$300 cash only for the Criminal Mischief charge pending his arraignment at Nashua District Court on April 4, 2018 and \$5,000 cash for the Duty to Report Charges at Hillsborough Superior Court South in Nashua, New Hampshire on April 4, 2018.
