On August 2, 2017 at approximately 10:00 AM officers arrested Maryanne Jacobsmeyer, 51, of 11 Lucier Street, Nashua, New Hampshire charging her with Kidnapping (Class A Felony), Robbery (Class A Felony), 2 counts of Burglary (Class B Felony), Falsifying Physical Evidence (Class B Felony), 3 counts of Theft by Unauthorized Taking or Transfer (Class B Felony), Habitual Offender (Class B Felony), and Theft by Deception (Class B Felony).

On June 8, 2017 officers responded to a residence for a report of a Burglary. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with the 92 year old victim and learned that during the burglary the suspect restrained him with duct tape. Further, the victim advised that the suspect made mention of a knife at the time of the burglary. The suspect subsequently stole numerous items from within and then stole the victim's vehicle in order to flee the scene.

The Criminal Investigation Division furthered the investigation. It was then learned that the suspect utilized the victim's stolen debit card to withdraw money from various Nashua banks. As the investigation continued, Detectives discovered that the suspect made fraudulent purchases at Kohls department store. As a result of the investigation, Jacobsmeyer was identified as the suspect. An arrest warrant was then completed for Jacobsmeyer and she was taken into custody on August 2, 2017. After the arrest, it was learned Jacobsmeyer had committed a burglary at the victim's residence prior to the incident on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017. A review of Jacobsmeyer's criminal record revealed prior theft related convictions, thus enhancing the theft related charges in this incident to a Class B Felony. Further, Jacobsmeyer is certified as a Habitual Offender through the New Hampshire Department of Motor Vehicles and, therefore, this charge was added.

Each Class A Felony is punishable by up to 15 years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Each Class B Felony is punishable by up to 7 years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Jacobsmeyer is currently being held at the Hillsborough County House of Corrections on \$250,000 cash bail, pending her arraignment on August 3, 2017 at the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit-District Division- Nashua Court.
