On September 12, 2017 at 10:29am officers from the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau arrested Carlos Lopez – Alzate, age 29, of 25 New Dunstable Road, Nashua, New Hampshire. Lopez – Alzate was charged with Second Degree Assault – Domestic Violence, Class B Felony; Second Degree Assault, Class B Felony, four counts of Domestic Violence, Class A Misdemeanor; and four counts of Simple Assault, Class A Misdemeanor.

On September 12, 2017 at approximately 9:56am the Nashua Police Department received a report of a male who assaulted a female outside of a downtown residence. Patrol officers responded to the area and met with a female who reported she was assaulted by her boyfriend, Carlos Lopez – Alzate. The victim stated that she had argued with her boyfriend, Lopez – Alzate, and that he strangled her and tripped her and caused her to fall. Officers also determined that Lopez – Alzate punched her in the head and torso. Lopez – Alzate fled the area, but was located by patrol at 25 New Dunstable Road, Nashua, NH and placed under arrest. Due to the nature of the reported assault, Nashua Police detectives were notified.

The Special Investigations Division's Domestic Violence Unit furthered the investigation with assistance from detectives. As a result, Lopez – Alzate was charged with Second Degree Assault, Class B Felony; four counts of Domestic Violence, Class A Misdemeanor and four counts of Simple Assault, Class A Misdemeanor.

Each Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Each Class A Misdemeanor is punishable up to one year in the County House of Corrections, exclusive of fines. Lopez – Alzate refused bail and was held at Valley Street Jail until his arraignment at the Hillsborough County Superior Court – South on September 13, 2017.
