On January 17, 2017 at approximately 3:13 a.m., members of the Nashua Police Department Uniformed Patrol Division arrested Jason Noury, age 40, of No Fixed Address Nashua, New Hampshire for Receiving Stolen Property, Class B Felony, 2 counts of Resisting Arrest/Detention, Class A Misdemeanor, Possession of Controlled Drug, Class A Misdemeanor, and Criminal Trespass, Class A Misdemeanor.

On January 17, 2017 at approximately 2:59 a.m Patrol Officers responded to 87 Chestnut Street for the report of a male on the roof. Noury was identified as the male on the roof and it was determined that he was Trespassed from that location. Noury failed to listen to the verbal commands of Patrol Officers and attempted to hide in the residence however he was eventually taken into custody. Upon being taken into custody, Noury was found to be in possession of marijuana, and several items that were later determined to have been stolen from Walgreen's on 283 Main Street in Nashua.

Noury's criminal record showed that he had two previous theft convictions. Because of these previous convictions his charge was upgraded to a Class B Felony.

A Class B Felony is punishable by up to 7 years imprisonment, exclusive of fines, while a Class A Misdemeanor is punishable by up to 1 year in the County House of Corrections exclusive of fines. Noury is being held at the Hillsborough County Department of Corrections on \$5000.00 Cash bail pending an arraignment at the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on January 18, 2017.
