On April 25, 2017 at 11:47 am, members of the Nashua Police Department Uniform Field Operations Bureau arrested Bounhange Tang, age 22, of 1577 Varnum Street, Lowell, Massachusetts for 20 counts of Identity Fraud, which are all Class A Felonys.

On March 17, 2017 Detectives from the Criminal Investigations Division received information from the University of Massachusetts-Lowell Police Department that one of their students, Bounhange Tang, had been obtaining credit card information while working at CVS Pharmacy, 214 Daniel Webster Highway in Nashua, New Hampshire.

Detectives then furthered this investigation with the assistance from the University of Massachusetts-Lowell Police Department and learned that Tang was a Pharmacy Technician at the CVS Pharmacy located at 214 Daniel Webster Highway in Nashua, NH. Detectives then discovered that from June of 2016 to December of 2016, while Tang was assisting customers at the CVS Pharmacy drive through window, Tang would obtain customer's credit card information by taking a picture of the front and back of the customer's credit card with his cell phone. Tang would then obtain the customers address from the CVS computer and then use this information to purchase items online and resell them. Detectives discovered that Tang obtained 20 customers credit card information. Detectives from the Nashua, NH Police Department then completed an arrest warrant for Tang charging him with Identity Fraud, Class A Felony.

A Class A Felony is punishable by up to fifteen years imprisonment, exclusive of fines for each Class A Felony. Tang's bail was set at \$50,000 cash or surety and will appear at the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on April 26, 2017.
