On March 20, 2017 at 1:41pm members of the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau, Patrol Division, arrested Christopher Plourde, age 24, of No Fixed Address, Nashua, New Hampshire for Receiving Stolen Property, a class A Misdemeanor.

On March 20, 2017 at approximately 9:30am patrol officers responded to a downtown residence for a report of a burglary that just occurred. One of the residents reported she was at home when Plourde, her roommate's ex-boyfriend, forced his way into the apartment and attempted to steal his ex-girlfriend's property. While inside the apartment, Plourde was confronted by the roommate and pushed her before he fled. The roommate was not injured from the assault. Plourde's ex-girlfirend was not home at the time and Plourde fled without any property from this residence.

Plourde was located by patrol officers in another area of downtown Nashua at approximately 1:00pm while investigating a theft from another residence. In that incident, Plourde was identified as a suspect of theft of jewelry by people Plourde knew. The value of the jewelry was less than \$1000.00 and it was determined that Plourde had pawned some of the jewelry for cash on March 17, 2017. Based on that, Plourde was arrested and charged with Receiving Stolen Property, Class A Misdemeanor. Detectives from the Special Investigations Division were notified and furthered the investigation. Based on their investigation, Plourde was also charged with Burglary, Class B Felony.

A Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. A Class Misdemeanor is punishable by up to one year in the House of Corrections, exclusive of fines. Plourde refused bail and is scheduled to be arraigned at the 9th Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on.
