On Wednesday February 03, 2021 members of the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau arrested Patrick Plummer, age 29, of 19 Sunnysdale Lane, Parsonsfield, Maine for Certain Uses of Computer Services Prohibited, Class B Felony and Indecent Exposure and Lewdness, Class B Felony.

In September of 2020 members of the Nashua Police Department's Cyber Crimes Against Children (C<sup>3</sup>) Unit with assistance from the Massachusetts Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force began an investigation into the sexual exploitation of children on the internet where a subject, identified as Plummer, was communicating with an individual he believed to be child. As a result of the investigation, Plummer was arrested in Massachusetts in September 2020 and held pending further court proceedings. Plummer was later charged as a fugitive from justice as a result of the Nashua Police Department investigation.

After waiving extradition, on February 03, 2021 the Nashua Police Department extradited Plummer from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to the State of New Hampshire. Plummer was released to the custody of the United States Marshal Service on an outstanding federal detention order and will be arraigned in the Hillsborough County Superior Court on a future date.

The Nashua Police Department received assistance in this investigation from the Georgetown Massachusetts Police Department and Massachusetts Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.

Each Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years imprisonment, exclusive of fines.

The Nashua Police Department is an affiliate of the Internet Crimes against Children (ICAC) Task Force, working to combat child exploitation in New Hampshire.
