On June 7th, 2019 at approximately 10:12 PM, officers from the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau, arrested Francis Wool, age 26, of Nashua, New Hampshire after a brief motor vehicle pursuit. Wool, who was also involved in a hit and run accident earlier in the evening, was charged with 2 counts of Operating after Certified as a Habitual Offender, Class B Felony, 2 counts of Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, Class A Misdemeanor, 2 counts of Conduct After an Accident, Class A Misdemeanor, Disobeying a Police Officer, Class A Misdemeanor, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Class A Misdemeanor, Unauthorized use of a Propelled Vehicle, Class A Misdemeanor, and Unregistered Vehicle, Violation.

At approximately 9:56 PM, the Nashua Police Department responded to a report of a domestic disturbance involving a knife. Patrol learned that Wool had been involved in an altercation with an adult male, who was known to him, before leaving the scene. That adult victim sustained non-life threatening injuries and was treated at a local hospital for those injuries. The Special Investigations Division was notified and furthered the investigation. As a result of that investigation, Wool was additionally charged with 4 counts of First Degree Assault-Domestic Violence, Class A Felony, 2 counts of Domestic Violence-Simple Assault, Class A Misdemeanor, and Criminal Mischief, Class A Misdemeanor.

A Class A Felony is punishable by up to 15 years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Each Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Each Class A Misdemeanor is punishable by up to 1 year in the County House of Corrections, exclusive of fines, and for some crimes, a loss of your driver's license. Each Violation is punishable up to a fine of \$1,000 and for some crimes, a loss of your driver's license. Wool was held on bail pending his arraignment on June 10th, 2019 at the Hillsborough County Superior Court South.
