On June 14, 2017 at approximately 4:45pm officers arrested Kenneth Psomos, age 49, of 22 Pulaski Street Apartment D5, Peabody, Massachusetts, for Theft by Deception, Class A Felony.

In January 2016 the Nashua Police Department Criminal Investigation Division was made aware by detectives at the Tyngsboro Police Department of an incident that occurred in December of 2015 at the Pheasant Lane Mall. The victim had made arrangements for her husband's burial with Dolans Funeral Home in Chelmsford, MA. The victim later misdialed the number for Dolan's Funeral home when she was making payment for the services. A male who was not associated with the funeral home answered the phone. The victim inquired if it was Dolan's Funeral Home and the male responded that it was. The victim explained she had a payment to make and the male told her that he would have someone call the victim back. A male called the victim back and made arrangements to take payment from the victim at the Pheasant Lane Mall. The victim then met with a male identified as Psomos outside the Pheasant Lane Mall where Psomos asked the victim to make the check out to AKS Inc. The victim questioned this but eventually wrote the check and also gave cash to Psomos. Through the investigation it was learned that AKS Inc was a cleaning company associated with Psomos.

Nashua Police Department detectives furthered the investigation and completed an arrest warrant charging Psomos with one count of Theft by Deception, Class A Felony. On June 14th patrol officers responded to the Essex County Correctional Facility in Middleton, Massachusetts and took custody of Psomos.

A Class A Felony is punishable by up to fifteen years imprisonment, exclusive of fines. Psomos was released on \$3,000 cash or surety bail and is pending his arraignment at the 9th Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on August 9, 2017
