On December 26, 2016 the Nashua Police Department concluded an investigation into a First Degree Assault that occurred on December 17, 2016. The following defendants were arrested: Nicholas Day, age 33, of 310 Elmwood Drive Hudson, New Hampshire, for First Degree Assault, Class A Felony and Falsifying Physical Evidence, Class B Felony, Stephanie Lemay, age 36, of 177 Main Street Apartment 202 Nashua, New Hampshire for Falsifying Physical Evidence, a Class B Felony, and Jeremy George, age 40, of 54 Longmeadow Road Beverly, Massachusetts, for Simple Assault Class A Misdemeanor.

On December 17 at approximately 4:38 am, members of the Nashua Police Department responded to 42 Main Street for the report of a male who had been stabbed. The victim reported the incident occurred at 177 Main Street Apartment 202, and that the suspect may have been Lemay's boyfriend, later identified as Day. Members of the Uniform Field Operations Bureau responded to 177 Main Street Apartment 202 and observed evidence of the assault. Detectives were notified and subsequently located the suspects in Hudson, NH. Warrants for all three suspects arrest were completed which they were later arrested on.

A Class A felony is punishable up to Fifteen years imprisonment, exclusive of fines, a Class B Felony is punishable by up to Seven years imprisonment, exclusive of fines, a Class A Misdemeanor is punishable up to 1 year imprisonment, exclusive of fines. Day was bailed on \$5,000.00 cash or surety bail, and Lemay was bailed on \$250.00 cash bail. They will be arraigned at the 9th Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on February 1, 2017. George was bailed on \$5,000 cash or surety and will be arraigned at the 9th Circuit-District Division-Nashua Court on February 8, 2017.
